[Samuel L. Abrams Foundation Fund](#) (May 31): for students who are graduates from select high schools in Cumberland, Dauphin, Perry, and York counties (Multiple Winners/Amount Varies)

[ACES Foundation Fund](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from high schools in Cumberland, Dauphin, and Perry counties, with a GPA of 2.5 or higher, planning on attending a school of higher education, and whose study shall be of business focus (management, administration, finance, actuarial sciences, etc.); also includes students studying trades such as cosmetology or HVAC with the intent to own their own business (Multiple winners/Amount Varies)

[Ames Charitable Foundation](#) (April 15): for graduating seniors with a minimum 3.0 GPA, who are dependent children of associates of Ames True Temper Inc., and plan to attend a post-secondary educational institution (Varies/up to \$4,000 per year for up to 4 years)

[G. Thomas Balsbaugh Memorial](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors of high schools in Dauphin county, planning to attend a four year college or university (1 winner/up to \$1,000 per year for up to 4 years)

[Binder Family Scholarship](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Steelton-Highspire High School, planning to attend a four year college or university (1 winner/Amount varies)

[George P. Boucek Memorial Scholarship of Delta Dental](#) (April 15): for students who are dependent children of associates of Delta Dental (either a management employee or an employee who is a member of UNITE!), with a minimum 2.5 GPA (2 winners/up to \$1,500 each)

[Owen Cole Brezitski Memorial Scholarship](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Bishop McDevitt High School with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 with plans to attend any 2 or 4 year college, university, or trade school. (1 winner/up to \$1,000)

[Harry N. and Melva A. Derickson Scholarship](#) (April 1): for students who are residents of Dauphin, Cumberland, and Perry Counties, for study in preparation for medical or dental school, nursing, physical therapy, other medical related fields, or engineering (Multiple winners; Amount varies)

[Lou Drane Fund / Joseph L. and Vivian E. Steele Music Scholarship](#) (March 1): for students from Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, and York counties, studying classical music composition, teaching, and performance (Multiple winners/up to \$5,000 each)

[Eash-Potter Scholarship](#) (April 1): The scholarship will support students committed to improving the campus and community climate for LGBTQ people (varies/amount varies)

[Educational Opportunity Fund](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Harrisburg High School and Sci-Tech High, with a minimum 2.5 GPA, pursuing higher education at a four year college or university (Multiple winners/up to \$1,250 each per year for up to 4 years)

[Ely-Wain Scholarship Fund](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from a high school in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, or Perry county with plans to pursue a field of study leading to a "green career" including to Environmental Science and Sustainable Technology. (Winners vary/Amount varies)

[Adrienne Zoe Fedok Art and Music Scholarship](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Central Dauphin High School, pursuing post secondary education in the field of art or music (1 winner/up to \$1,000)

[Grove Family Fund #1](#) (Rolling Deadline): for junior and senior students from Harrisburg high school, Sci-Tech high school, and Steelton-Highspire high school to attend HACC to take academic or college-prep courses while still in high school (Winners vary/Award varies)

[Dr. Paul E. Hoffner Leadership Fund](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Upper Dauphin High School, with a minimum 3.25 GPA, planning to attend a four-year college or university, who demonstrate leadership skills (1 winner/up to \$2,000 per year for up to 4 years)

[HomeBuilders Association Scholarship Fund](#) (March 15): for students who have graduated from a high school in Dauphin, Cumberland, or Perry county with plans to attend an institution of higher learning or trade school. Preference is given to students in the building industry or related fields. (Winners vary/Amount varies)

[HomeBuilders Association Sales & Marketing Council Scholarship Fund](#) (April 1): for students who have graduated from a high school in Dauphin, Cumberland, or Perry county and plan to attend college or trade school furthering their education in the Building Industry or related field. (Winners vary/Amount varies)

[Roberta L. Houpt Scholarship](#) (April 1): for students from Dauphin, Cumberland and Perry counties, studying nursing (Multiple winners/up to \$2,000 each)

[David M. Kleppinger Family Scholarship Fund](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors of Hershey High School in Hershey, PA or Emmaus High School in Emmaus, PA who will attend Penn State Main Campus or Florida Gulf Coast University as a full-time student planning to study political science, pre-law, finance, nursing, or general liberal arts (One Hershey HS Grad, One Emmaus HS Grad/up to \$500 each)

[Leader Scholarship Fund](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, Lancaster, or York county with plans to attend HACC Harrisburg's campus as a full-time student to study in the LPN Program (Varies/Varies)

[Leon I. Lock and Barbara R. Lock Scholarship](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors and graduates within the last five years of any high school in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, or Perry county, who will attend HACC to study nursing. (Multiple winners/up to \$500)

[Leon Lowengard Scholarship](#) (July 15): for students attending Harrisburg City Public Schools and surrounding districts with a minimum GPA of 2.0; preference will be given to students who are of Jewish faith and to undergraduate students (Multiple winners/Amount varies)

[Bruce Mangione Fund](#) (April 1): for students who attend school within the city of Harrisburg and children of the employees of NRG Energy (Harrisburg office) or Harrisburg Hilton and Towers (2 winners/up to \$1,500 each)

[McInroy-Sheffer People Trust Scholarship](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, Lycoming, Tioga or York counties, attending Mansfield University, York College, Central Penn College, Pennsylvania College of Technology, HACC or Harrisburg University studying elementary education, culinary arts, communications, fundamental business operations, hands-on trades, nursing, management, or e-business (Multiple winners/up to \$2,000 each)

[Zachary Moore Music Memorial Fund](#) (April 15): for graduating seniors from Susquehanna Township High School, Harrisburg High School, Sci-Tech High School, Capital Area School for the Arts (CASA), Steelton-Highspire High School, Central Dauphin High School, or Central Dauphin East High School with plans to attend a two-year, 4-year, or trade school to study music. (Varies/Up to \$1,000)

[PARTS Scholarship Pennsylvania Automotive Recycling Trade Society](#) (April 1): for a child or step child of an owner who is an eligible active PARTS member or an employee who has worked for an eligible PARTS member for at least one year prior to March 15 or a child or step child of such an employee (Multiple winners/Amount varies)

[Penn HOSA Foundation Scholarship](#) (April 1): for affiliated, paid HOSA chapter members by January 1 with financial need (Multiple winners/Amount varies)

[Pennsylvania House of Representatives Scholarship](#) (March 1): for graduating seniors and legal residents of PA, with a minimum 3.0 GPA, planning to attend any 4 year college in PA, and demonstrating leadership and community service (2 winners/Amount varies)

[Lynn E. Poffenberger Memorial Scholarship Fund](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Central Dauphin High School and Dauphin Vo-Tech School who are residents of Middle Paxton Township or Dauphin Borough, exhibit financial need, and have been an active member of the community. (2 winners—1 from Central Dauphin, 1 from Dauphin Vo-Tech/up to \$1,000 each)

[Rice Family Scholarship Fund of Eichelbergers, Inc.](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors who are dependent children of employees of Eichelbergers, Inc. (employed for at least one year), with a minimum 2.5 GPA, planning to attend any two or four year college in PA (Multiple winners/up to \$2,000 each per year for up to 4 years)

[Oliver Rosenberg Educational Trust](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Sci-Tech High, Harrisburg High School, Bishop McDevitt, and Dauphin County Technical School, attending a state supported college or university in Pennsylvania (Multiple winners/Amount varies)

[Mary Sachs Memorial Award](#) (April 1): for graduating female high school seniors in Cumberland, Dauphin, Perry, or Lancaster county with plans to study fashion, fashion design, retailing, entrepreneurship, or business (Multiple winners/Amount varies)

[Ray S. Shoemaker Scholarship](#) (July 15): for students attending Harrisburg City Public Schools and surrounding districts with a minimum GPA of 2.0; preference will be given to undergraduate students, but graduate students may apply (Multiple winners/Amount varies)

[Anil and Neema Thakrar Family Fund #1](#) (April 1): for students from Cumberland, Dauphin, and Perry counties with a GPA between 2.0-3.0 with plans to study math, science, or engineering (1 winner/Amount Varies)

[Anil and Neema Thakrar Family Fund #2](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, and Perry counties, with a minimum 2.0 GPA, studying a medical related discipline (1 winner/Amount Varies)

[Jill B. Whiting Scholarship](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Central Dauphin High School, with a minimum 2.5 GPA, studying music or music education (1 winner/up to \$1,000)

[Dr. Francis J. Viozzi Memorial Educational Scholarship for Environmental Studies](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from any Dauphin or Lebanon County high school with plans to attend a 4-year institution of higher education. The student must have a concentration in science related to environmental conservation (biology, wildlife management, environmental studies, engineering, etc.). (1 winner/up to \$1,500)

[Jack and Edna May Yost Scholarship](#) (April 1): for graduating seniors from Dauphin or Cumberland county high schools, with a minimum 2.5 GPA, attending any two or four year college or university; preference will be given to children of postal employees and students who plan to major in nursing or education (Multiple winners/up to \$5,000 each)

Matching Award Opportunities

TFEC is a partner with AES/PHEAA's "Partnerships for Access To Higher Education," or PATH Program. Scholarship recipients are eligible to have their awards matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by the PATH program. PHEAA may grant matching funds to scholarship recipients who are enrolled in an approved Pennsylvania college or career school, who are a state grant recipient and who demonstrate financial need. The match provides last dollar support for tuition and fees. The scholarship recipient's information is submitted to PHEAA by TFEC staff.
